	<p>Studies of Ethics and Philosophy Key Idea: CW3 People make decisions using a range of religious perspectives and ethical frameworks.</p> <p>People's shared humanity leads them to ask the same big questions about the origin and meaning of life. During this unit students will explore philosophical approaches to the meaning of life. Students will apply a decision making process to ethical issues and explain how and why people hold different ethical position.
