| World Music | <p>In this unit, students will respond to a varied repertoire of music from a range of Countries and cultural contexts. Repertoire will include music from Africa, Latin America, Japan, Greece, India and China. We will look at modern rock and pop songs from a variety of cultures as well as more traditional music, and how the two have been combined into new styles. Students will aurally analyse, sing and play, in tune and in appropriate style, individually and with others. | The Musical | <p>The musical is one of the most popular forms of theatrical entertainment today. In a “classic” musical, there are memorable songs, lively dance routines and lavish sets and costumes. In this unit, we will sing, play and listen to a range of songs from musicals, from early American examples like “The Sound of Music” to modern rock musicals and current Australian musicals like “The Boy from Oz” and “Wicked”. Students will arrange and perform their own “mini musical” in small groups.
