Weeks 1 to 10	<p>As an introduction to Year 9 Japanese, students will spend this term reinforcing their Japanese knowledge over a range of topics, including holidays and recreation, shopping and dining out. The grammar to be studied in units 7 to 9 of Mirai 2, will cover counters, verb conjugation and the use of adjectives.
